Building local capacity for change
in rural Canada and Australia

Where the green grass grows

- Rural Idyll
- Assumptions of social cohesion and collective efficacy
- Different context – criminological theories



Canada and Australia's commonalities

- Rural crime rates higher than urban crime rates
- Large indigenous population
- Incentives for rural “stints”
- Local capacity to respond to issues is lacking



North Battleford, Canada

- Population 14,000
- Highest Crime Severity Index in Canada
- Violence and disorder

Let's just see what tomorrow brings

- Homeless shelter and community garden
- Downtown revitalization
- Intersection mural
- Community survey



Roma, Queensland

- Population 6,800 people
- Crime rate approx. 12,000 per 100,000 people
- Issues with youth crime and violence
- Mental health and suicide





Walking in
country lanes

- Plan for creating youth space
- Plans to take back space and revitalize for local residents
- Integration of Aboriginal and Australian culture

Learnings from the rural landscape

- Cohesion is assumed **WITHIN** rural communities but this does not translate to action
- Loss of brainpower and local leaders
- The commonwealth and willingness to take ownership
